QUESTION 1

Judith and Richard married two years ago, in Dei Dei Marriage Registry in Abuja. After their marriage, Judith decided to get a house maid to assist the family with house chores, of which Richard was not in support. Richard promised to assist Judith with the house chores and other necessary things to keep the home running, but she still went ahead to get a house maid. Judith teaches in one of the secondary schools in Kule Abuja. Judith goes out very early in the morning and comes back very late at night. This happens from Mondays to Fridays, and on weekends, she goes partying and comes back very late, while the husband must have slept. She does not have time for her husband and the family, leaving everything for her housemaid to attend to. After some time, Judith started coming to the house once in a while and eventually she stopped coming. The house maid had to leave, because Richard said her service is no more needed. It is a year now that Judith has refused to come home, and this is causing loneliness and a lot of inconveniencies for Richard. Richard is not happy about the situation, but he does not know what to do. Richard wants to enjoy all the benefit that flows from marriage. He is seeking a matrimonial relief of the restitution of his conjugal rights, but the court will only consider his application upon certain condition and proof. Critically discuss, citing the relevant case laws or statutory provisions.

QUESTION 2

Jade and Wole grew up in the same village called Lato in Oyo State of Nigeria. They went to the same primary and secondary schools and also attended the same university. In 2018, they applied for a job in the same oil company in Port Harcourt, fortunately both of them were employed. Their friendship grew and it became so cordial, because they work in the same company. Jade and Wole cannot do without each other and this is known to everybody in their place of work. Jade and Wole have been relating and presenting themselves as husband and wife. Specifically, Jade has been presenting herself to people that she is married to Wole, backing it up with pictures and document, but Wole has never stopped Jade from doing so. Some months back, Wole celebrated a statutory marriage with Ayo, but the wife is not in Nigeria. Wole's wife will be coming back to Nigeria next month to settle down with him. Wole has made up his mind to stop Jade from portraying herself as his wife, because, it just dawned on him that, if his wife
